The following are summaries of key points from the meeting agenda:

1. Brief Overview of Project

Tracy McPherson (NORC) provided a brief update on the Hilton Adolescent SBIRT project. Currently the Learning Collaborative consists of schools of nursing and social work. The ratio of schools of nursing to social work is approaching 50:50 with slightly more in social work. There are approximately over 130 members of the Learning Collaborative.

2. Learning Collaborative Member Updates

Tracy invited the Learning Collaborative members participating in the call to provide updates on their current initiatives. The following members provided information about their SBIRT programs:

Mary Velasquez, University of Texas at Austin – Their School of Social Work has a HRSA grant for bilingual and bicultural students. As part of the grant, students take a semester of courses including motivational interviewing which includes SBIRT. For their field placements, they are then placed in adult clinics. Valesquez was also involved in developing the SBIRT manual used for this program. The current focus is on adults not adolescents so she is interested in learning more about adolescent SBIRT. She recommended the book “Motivational Interviewing: A Guide for Medical Trainees” by Stephen Rollnick as a resource for those interested in motivational interviewing. The book talks about the differences in brief interviewing and motivational interviewing as well as how it can be incorporated into SBIRT.

Valire Copeland, University of Pittsburgh - The School of Social Work received a workforce training grant in which they created a certificate program and SBIRT related courses. She has spoken to project officers from SAMHSA who want to emphasize more schools of social work incorporating SBIRT in their curricula. Valire also sits on an interprofessional working group that looks across integrated curricula to prepare different disciplines to work together to incorporate SBIRT into curricula.

Suzanne Hardeman, University of South Carolina – Their program uses a common curricula across multiple disciplines. Each department does separate check offs and slightly different practice scenarios to fit their subject and topics however the core curricula is the same.

Kalea Brenner, University of Missouri – The students in the nursing programs do the same common curricula as the medical students. A challenge of sharing curricula is that it uses the medical model which is not as applicable to schools of social work. Social work students noted that the shared models taught are more medically focused than behaviorally or emotionally which would be more appropriate when working with clients.

3. Request to Schedule Walk-Thru Calls

Danielle Noriega (NORC) has conducted one-on-one walk-thru calls with over 25 Learning Collaborative members. These calls are informal 30 minutes calls with members regarding

their programs and experiences with SBIRT, substance use education and adolescent health. Learning Collaborative members who have not already completed a walk-thru call should sign up using one of two methods: email Danielle with 3-4 available times Monday-Friday 10-5 PM EST or fill out the Doodle poll in the April newsletter that will be sent out Friday April 17th. Upon submitting availability, Danielle will send a calendar hold for the call.

4. Review of RFA Timeline

The RFA is still being drafted and is set to be released in the late April/May timeframe. To ensure that the RFA is thorough, Learning Collaborative members may send questions or requests that they want to ensure are addressed in the RFA. Please submit these concerns to Danielle.

NORC will be conducting a Risk Assessment to include Learning Collaborative members. The release date of is to be determined.
