2. **Track A RCT Field Test Evaluation – Update (Tracy)**
 - Request for Application (RFA): Awarded to 11 programs
 - Track A Data review

NOTES:

Our initial review of the data shows an increase in competency for those that participated in training. There is a difference between those who were trained and those who were not trained. We plan to review the Kognito simulation scores for competency assessment. Attitudes show to be more favorable from pre to post among those who were trained compared to those who were not trained. Sense of competence and self-confidence also show increase for those that were trained.

QUESTION POSED TO THE GROUP: is the small change enough to publish? Is it clinically significant?

RESPONSE: Yes because it's still a positive change and shows advancement in the field. It may also be beneficial to look at age and audience because it shows what types of trainees are most receptive.

There is consensus for writing up the data and submitting it.

QUESTION POSED TO THE GROUP: Is it a contribution of the literature?

RESPONSE: No data currently on the attitude changes with the instructors – comfort teaching it after the training. Potentially something to look at in the future.
