Meeting Minutes

The following items include summaries of discussions from the meeting.

Brief Overview of Project

Eric Goplerud, NORC Vice President of Public Health Research, provided an introduction to the Adolescent SBIRT project citing the four major project components includes: a Steering Committee of various subject matter experts, the Learning Collaborative to connect faculty from schools of nursing and social work, the development of a Kognito interactive online training program and a mini-grant program to pilot and evaluate the interactive program.

Review of Timeline/Strategic Plan

The RFA to apply for the mini-grant program is scheduled to be released in early spring 2015 with first round funding released in the fall. Through this program, selected schools will serve as pilot sites to integrate the developed online simulation into their curricula and offer feedback on its application. The grants will value up to \$10,000 to help with piloting the programs.

In an effort to engage members of the Learning Collaborative individually, NORC has sent a request via email to all members to schedule “walk thru calls.” These calls will take approximately 30 minutes and will allow NORC to have a sense of what people are currently doing in terms of adolescent substance use and what they would like to do. Jo Dee Gottlieb and Carrie Rishel provided brief overviews of their walk-thru calls.

An announcement for a SAMHSA SBIRT grant opportunity was sent to the Learning Collaborative members. This opportunity is not related to this Adolescent Hilton project but would be a good opportunity for schools interested in integrating SBIRT into their programs. NORC is open to partnering on evaluation for this grant. Kognito and NORC will hold a webinar on February 25th titled “Innovative Approaches to Engage Health Professionals in Screening and Brief Intervention for Substance Use” which could be useful for those interested in applying for the SAMHSA grant.

Development of Interactive Patient Simulation Training

Cyrille Adam of Kognito provided an overview of the development of the interactive patient simulation training program. The program will last approximately 45 minutes to 1.5 hours and will feature avatars and simulations for nursing and social work students. As part of the development process, Kognito has invited Learning Collaborative members to participate in an online review group. Members of this group will be invited to participate in various activities including focus groups. NORC sent a communication with the [link to the survey](#) to sign up for this review group. Learning Collaborative members are also asked to forward this review group opportunity to students to engage them in the development process.

Rosemary Alamo and Christie Abdul have both used Kognito patient simulations in their programs. They will send descriptions and links to their adaptations of the simulations to NORC

to serve as a resource for the Collaborative. Stephen Strobbe will also send information about his work with clinical simulations at University of Michigan at Ann Arbor.
