## Featured Program Speakers

*Carrie W. Rishel, MSW, PhD - Associate Professor and Director of Integrated Mental and Behavioral Health Training Program, WVU School of Social Work*

Summary of program: Currently receiving a HRSA/SAMHSA grant to train MSW students on behavioral health which includes offering participating students \$10,000 stipends. Components include field placement, targeted curriculum, core coursework including capstone, and mentorship/employee placement support. Could see SBIRT fitting into this program in a similar way that WVU has used the Kognito Suicide Prevention Simulation.

*Pamela Lusk, DNP, RN, PMHNP-BC, FAANP - Clinical Associate Professor, The University of Arizona College of Nursing*

Summary of Program: Screening taught to nursing students with a 40 hours requirement of substance abuse training (if relevant faculty is available.) Students log in hours in an online system which allows faculty to track work. Also offer a course on motivational interviewing.

### **Question and Answer**

*Summary from Discussion* – The definition of “adolescents” for this project is not defined as of now and will be a major point of discussion as the project develops. At the current stage of the project, “adolescents” are under the legal age and do not include college aged young adults. If it were to include young adults, the experiences between the groups will need to be taken into consideration as 15 year old may not have the same experiences with substances as a 19 year old submerged in the college culture.

The curriculum development is currently in the planning stage and will include marijuana and alcohol. Marijuana induced psychosis is a major issue that is rarely taught and should be considered for inclusion in the trainings. NORC will share this suggestion to Kognito.
