Tracy McPherson moderated this monthly call. Summaries of agenda items are listed below:

Track A and Track B Program Updates

Track A

The 11 schools who are participating in the Track A simulation only evaluation program have been randomly split into an implementation or delayed control group. Currently, the implementation group has had access to the simulation and is in the process of ending their access period. They will fill out post-tests. After this, the delayed control group will start their access period. Track A ends in May 2016. NORC will have data available to share based on this evaluation.

Track B

Danielle Noriega provided a brief overview of the 12 schools participating in the Track B full implementation of the simulation and Instructor's Toolkit. Schools have had calls with the NORC team to provide updates on progress. Currently, all schools are in various stages of

implementation however many of them have noted that they are training faculty on the simulation and toolkit. Not many schools are implementing the curriculum fully in the classroom yet. Some are piloting it into at least one of their courses with students to influence how it is rolled out into other courses.

NORC will continue to check-in with these schools and provide updates on future LC calls. Schools from both Track A and Track B will provide brief presentation on calls as well. If there are any LC members who are not participating in Track A or B but are integrating SBIRT and/or the curriculum into their courses and would like to provide a brief presentation on a future call, please email the SBIRT Team so that we may put aside time on the agenda.

Learning Collaborative Member Presentations

The following LC members who are participating in the Track B program provided brief presentations on their implementation programs:

California University of Pennsylvania – Social Work

The goal of their implementation program is to layer the SBIRT into their curriculum through traditional lecture and case studies then role play as well as both the Kognito simulation and simulated patients. The training process started in winter 2015 prior to the January 1st kick-off of Track B. Master's students in the children and substance abuse elective courses received some training on motivational interviewing during that semester. This semester will focus on training the BSW students who have already received pre-tests and packets with the NIAAA screening tool and resources on substance use. They have also set up an internal website for students and faculty that will house resources, information on the Kognito simulation, links to videos and information on policy.

They held a workshop on March 4th that included 66 students and field instructors. The workshop was a training that took place before a panel on opioids. Participants were given CEUs for the training and were added to the website to access resources. The training covered the first 2 Learner's Guide modules and the Kognito program. The workshop and panel was open to everyone so there was interdisciplinary participation in the overall event.

Program next steps include training some of the classes on the Kognito program and some on the standardized student actor patients.

University of Michigan, Ann Arbor – Nursing

NORC provided slides to go along with Stephen's presentation with the agenda prior to the LC call. The key elements of the Track B implementation includes training approximately 323 people which includes undergraduates, masters, doctoral students, and nursing faculty. The undergraduate program at UMSN requires that 25% of clinical hours are delivered through simulation where two of six 4-hour clinical segments will be dedicated to substance abuse with one on Adolescent SBIRT (2 hours online pre-learning and two face-to-face simulation). An initial pilot was conducted with the psych clinical faculty and the clinical learning center staff. There was time during the first round dedicated to student feedback to help guide the next segments. The feedback from students and faculty regarding the Kognito simulation was overall very positive. A readiness ruler was used in place of a formal evaluation for the first round because evaluation measures were not ready during planning. To date, 40 students and 10 faculty and CLC staff were trained during the first clinical rotation. The next rotation begins mid-March which will include a

change in order with the Adolescent SBIRT segment coming second not last as it was in the first rotation. Strobbe noted that right now, he conducted the clinical segments but is hoping to get the family nurse practitioners to participate in some form.

Multi-Site Evaluation

NORC is hoping to make the data from the Track A and Track B available as a form of multi-site evaluation. More details on this are to come.

As noted on prior calls, LC members are interested in another RFA. NORC is working on drafting an RFA for the fall hoping to incorporate feedback of including other disciplines and/or the current workforce. More details on this effort are forthcoming.
