Learning Collaborative Presentation

Dr. Strobbe discussed the current integration of SBIRT into the curricula at the University of Michigan School of Nursing. His presentation included both discussion of publications used as the base for his teaching and the current coursework and initiatives. Key efforts include:

- Invited lecturers in undergraduate coursework
- SBIRT in current coursework such as *NURS 230: Health Promotion across the Lifespan and NURS 358/NSC 358 and Mental Health and Illness across the Lifespan* which includes a “flipping the classroom” approach
- Inclusion of AA meetings into lecture and clinical hours
- Clinical placements
- Upcoming clinical learning center for simulations

Questions for Presenter:

- Can you provide more information about the SAMHSA simulations that you have used as resources?

SAMHSA provides public resources that are free to access. Dr. Strobbe has used some of their interactive online tools that include cases and allows participants to respond to the cases. To access, visit <http://www.medscape.com/>. Individuals will need to log in, or register, using one of the icons in the upper right hand corner. Participants are allowed to select from one or more of many specialties. Articles and continuing education offerings on substance use and addiction are generally listed under psychiatry. One of the icons found on most pages is for “CME & Education.” Entering “SBIRT” into the search function under this heading will navigate toward the interactive tools mentioned in this presentation.

- Do you train with social workers?

Dr. Strobbe does not currently do work with social workers. His publication *Teaching college students about Alcoholics Anonymous: An experiential approach* includes some information on social workers. However, he primarily has done presentation with nurse practitioners.

- Have you had students do SBIRT in simulations?

UMSN is moving towards including SBIRT into simulations. The school is opening a clinical learning center which offers the opportunity to do more SBIRT simulations. This will become part of the preparation for clinical practice.

RFA

The RFA will be released June 22nd. There has been some delays from the original release date due to a change in the RFA program structure. In an effort to open the opportunity to more LC members, the program has been divided into two tracks – Track A and Track B.

Track A is a stipend for \$2,000 for participation in the field test evaluation of the Adolescent SBIRT online virtual human simulation training only, during the period of approximately January 2016 through May 2016. LC members who are receiving SBIRT funds are eligible to apply for Track A without the stipend.

Track B is a stipend for up to \$10,000 for full implementation of the Adolescent SBIRT program, including an Instructor's Toolkit and online virtual human simulation training, during the period of approximately January 2016 through September 2017.

Walk-Thru Calls

All members are encouraged to schedule walk-thru calls with NORC to introduce them to their specific programs. These calls are useful to understanding the needs of schools and to understand what is happening in the field. Members only need to participate in one call. For those who have not done a call, please email Danielle to set up a 30 minute walk-thru. These calls are required to apply for the RFA program.
