Meeting Summary:

The following are discussion summaries from this meeting, led by Tracy McPherson.

RFA

NORC is currently in the review process of the Adolescent SBIRT RFA program applications. NORC received 10 applications for Track A and 13 for Track B. The RFAs are posted on the [website](#) as a reference for the requirements of each track. The review process consists of NORC conducting a first round review of each applications and then second review by partners. Steering Committee members are welcome to do a review of applications if they would like to be involved in the process. CSWE is doing the secondary review of the social work applications. Joan Stanley expressed interest in reviewing some of the nursing applications on behalf of AACN. NORC has already followed up on any clarifications for the Track A applications and is therefore in final review for this track. The NORC team has reviewed the social work Track B applications and is now reviewing nursing. The awards are on track to be announcements before the end of the year to begin implementation in January 2016.

Need Assessment

The needs assessment survey developed in collaboration with IRETA has been released. NORC sent it out to the Learning Collaborative on August 18th with several reminder announcements following. Since the launch, there have been 55 completes of the survey. This survey is open to everyone – faculty, students, practitioners etc. therefore the Steering Committee is encouraged to pass the survey on to interested colleagues. Web Analytics

Tracy provided a break-down of some of the web analytics for the adolescent SBIRT website located at sbirt.webs.com. In addition to the website, she also gave an update on the number of learning collaborative members and “walk-thru” calls completed with LC members to get to know their programs. Kognito Updates

Kaley Sullivan provided an update on the SBIRT simulation progress. The three practice conversations are fully animated and will be ready to be shared next week. The didactic content is about 75% complete and will be built into the program. Kognito will share demos next week of the programs in progress. The final script that Kognito needs feedback on from the Steering Committee is for the Emily conversation which takes place in a school setting. Kaley will contact the Steering Committee via email with more details on this review activity.

Kognito acknowledged the work that participating Steering Committee members have provided during the development of the program. Kognito is interested in recruiting new social work and nursing students into their SBIRT Review Group to help with the final development of the simulation. NORC will include information and a link to sign up in the September Steering Committee newsletter. Steering Committee members are encouraged to forward this opportunity on to colleagues or students to encourage participation.

Recommended Screening Tools for Adolescents

NORC requested screening tools and resources to help with the creation of the Adolescent SBIRT Trainer’s Guide. The CRAFFT and GAIN were widely recommended. The inclusion of a pros/cons of

the top five screening tools could be useful to include in the guide as well as a summary of these tools as a quick view of the risk levels of each and what they measure. SAMHSA and NIH may be a good resource on the features of the tools including pros/cons. NIAAA is also a good tool though it is only focused on alcohol. Some tools have not been around long enough to have research associated with them so those can be included but should have that note.

Steering Committee members are encouraged to continue to send examples of screening tools to SBIRTeam@norc.org.

SBIRT Education Webinars

For Year Two, NORC is launching webinars on SBIRT related topics. These calls will most likely be hour long and on-demand for the Learning Collaborative members and the broader community. As of now, there are no credits attached with these webinars, however several Steering Committee members suggested some form of continuing education credit to boost participation. Possible associations to look into for offering credits include Association of Social Work Boards (ASWB) and the National Association of Social Work (NASW). AACN could attach credits to attract practicing nurses, however, AACN will have to be involved in the planning and promotion of the webinars. Joan and the NORC team can talk more about involving AACN. Similarly, CSWE may be able to offer credit for social workers if the webinar is open to social work practitioners. Erin will talk more about this opportunity with NORC.

To ensure that the topics for the webinars are useful and well-attended, NORC released a short three question survey to the Learning Collaborative to gauge interest in topics. Steering Committee members are welcomed to fill out this survey to recommend topics and pass it along. On call Steering Committee suggestions for topics included integrating SBIRT education into the growing digital community of nursing academics.
