**RFA Review Update**

Track A and Track B participants have been notified of award and are currently undergoing onboarding calls and paperwork. **Development of Interactive Patient Simulation Training (Kognito)**

Cyrille Adam of Kognito provided a brief update on the development of the interactive patient simulation training including a debrief of a beta-testing event at the CSWE meeting in Denver,

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CO on October 15, 2015. Kognito and NORC conducted 30 minutes sessions with participants to go through the program and offer feedback. Cyrille thanked those who participated and noted that Kognito is incorporating the feedback into the program. ### **SAMHSA Request for Applications: Screening, Brief Intervention, and Referral to Treatment (SBIRT) Health Professions Student Training**

SAMHSA has released a [grant](#) for SBIRT student training open to universities, colleges and residency programs to develop and implement training programs to teach students in health professions SBIRT. This is open to social work and nursing as well as other professions such as residents and psychologists. The grant length is up to 3 years and up to \$290,000 award. Applications are due January 4th. If members are interested in this grant and would like to work with NORC on evaluation and/or with Kognito with one of their simulation programs in your training program, both would be happy to set up a call to discuss how to collaborate to submit an application to this great opportunity.
