The following are discussion summaries from this meeting, moderated by Tracy McPherson.

Learning Collaborative Outreach and Engagement

Danielle Noriega provided a summary of the Learning Collaborative activities that occurred for the month of October. NORC held a Learning Collaborative monthly call on October 13th, 2015 with 23 participants. Agenda items included updates on the RFA program and upcoming conference presentations and activities. Cyrille Adam also provided an update on the development of the online simulation training. As of November 4th, the Learning Collaborative listserv consists of 146 subscribers with two new members added in the month of October. Of those who identified in an area, 65 members are nursing and 57 are social work.

In the last 30 days, the project website (sbirt.webs.com) received 4,534 page views with 163 on the *About the Project* page and 135 on the *Resources* page. There has been some reorganizing of the Resources page including drop-downs and submenus to accommodate the growing amount of resources that the project has been receiving. There is also a new SBIRT Education platform (sbirteducation.com) that houses the links to all of the NORC related SBIRT initiatives. This platform was briefly presented at the Learning Collaborative meeting and has already received 494 hits.

Call for Resources

NORC is constantly collecting resources to share with the Learning Collaborative, post on the website and to incorporate into educational materials created for the project. Steering Committee members

are encouraged to send resources to SBIRTeam@norc.org. Ken Winters recommended incorporating the juvenile justice field into the project and working with them to develop learning tools. He has a contact in the juvenile justice court field who he will connect with to gauge interest.

Webinar Topic Series

In 2016, NORC is launching a webinar series of about four Adolescent SBIRT related topics. A brief three question survey was released to the Learning Collaborative to gauge interest on specific topics for this. Ten people responded to this survey. The top five topics of interest were:

1. Motivational Interviewing
2. Specific Screening Tools (ex. CRAFFT)
3. Overview of Brief Intervention
4. Case Studies of Social Work SBIRT Programs
5. Including Field Supervisors

Danielle noted that because there were only ten responses, the difference between the “top 5” topics were not significant however this list offers a snapshot of the topics of interest. Additionally, because the survey was anonymous, it is possible that this survey is skewed towards social work and therefore the interest in #4 could be applicable to nursing as well. Mike Brooks noted that he supported the topics listed and recommended organizing the series not necessarily in the order of which topics were most popular but according to how they would relate and build off of each other. Motivational Interviewing is a hot topic in social work and would have a lot of interest. Not many social work schools teach screening so that would be a good webinar as well. Steering Committee members noted support of doing more interprofessional webinars rather than focuses them either nursing or social work. CE’s would also be useful to incentivize participation in the webinars. Potential partners for these webinars would be CCSW and CSWE. AACN could also potentially partner on a webinar geared towards nurses as well.

Kognito Development

Kognito and NORC conducted beta-testing sessions at CSWE in Denver. During these sessions, participants were able to walk through one of the conversations and offer feedback. Overall the responses were positive. People noted that the characters were realistic and the conversations were good practice for the SBI skills. Some changes that will come out of the feedback received include making the engagement meter more visible and minor navigation changes. Kognito will update the simulation with these changes for the next Beta- Testing event that will take place at the AACN Baccalaureate Education Conference on November 19-21, 2015 in Orlando, FL. NORC and Kognito will do a presentation with a demo as a Breakfast Session as well as have a table during the conference. Steering Committee members are encouraged to help recruit for participation in the beta-testing session. The link for more information is located at:
